Parish Pastoral Plan 2018

We are blessed to have a number of active groups and parishioners involved in a wide range of outreach and lay Ministries that contribute significantly to the pastoral needs of our Parish and Church communities.

Our Parish Pastoral Plan aims at furthering the work carried out in forming our Parish and the direction given by the community. It can be thought of as a triangle with layers of objectives and activities leading towards achieving our Parish vision.



Our Vision

Our vision is what we are striving to be; we want everything we do to contribute to us becoming a community of communities – celebrating our diverse groups in diverse ways.

Our Principles

Our principles are *‘the rules we play by’* which are inspired by Pope Francis:

“The Parish is the presence of the Church in a given territory, an environment for hearing God’s word, for growth in Christian life, for dialogue, proclamation, charitable outreach, worship and celebration. In all its activities, the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers. It is a community of communities, a sanctuary where the thirsty come to drink in the midst of their journey, and a centre of constant missionary outreach.”

Pope Francis, *Evangelium gaudium* 28



1. Our Parish is a community of communities, in our diversity we find unity and strength as members of the Body of Christ. Together we belong, grow and connect the parts working together for the good of the whole body.

2. Our Parish has a preferential option for the poor, creating conditions for marginalised voices to be heard. To defend the defenceless, and to assess lifestyles, policies and social institutions in terms of their impact on the poor. This option for the poor does not mean pitting one community against another, but rather, it calls us to strengthen the whole community by assisting the whole community by assisting those who are most vulnerable.

3. Our Parish Leadership is collaborative and transparent, encouraging active dialogue between communities where all voices are valued and listened to.

4. The identity of Eucharistic Communities within our Parish is respected and the principle of subsidiarity is applied. *(Those things that can be decided at the lowest possible level are decided at that level)*

Our Goals

Our Goals set the direction/focus for the Parish for the next 5 years. They were set by the community present at the Stewardship day at St Bernard’s College in mid-2016.

1. **Active Faith in our homes** – Christ created His church on earth to be us, His people, not a building so we seek out and implement ways to support and develop active, lived faith in our homes and everyday lives not just on Sunday

2. **Communicating with respect for diversity** – we have many talents across the parish and everyone has something to offer, we enable everyone to communicate with our diverse groups in the way that suits them best
3. **Build relationships and community** – one of our strengths is the number of parishioners we have but that can also be overwhelming, we are welcoming to all and celebrate within our Church communities and across the wider Parish

Our Parish Pastoral Plan

Our Parish Pastoral Plan outlines the six specific areas we focus on and the actions or activities we want to achieve within the next 1-5 years. The Parish Pastoral Plan has been developed in alignment with topics from the 2017 Wellington Archdiocese Synod.

There are many activities that fit into more than one area of focus but they have only been listed once to avoid confusion.

1. Liturgy

A focus on the liturgy will enhance and enrich our celebration of and participation in the Eucharist, sacraments and prayer.

Our Enablers

Our enablers are some of the resources and requirements we need to achieve the Parish Pastoral Plan as well as the continued running of our Parish.

Synod topics 'Go you are sent to use your assets wisely' and 'Go you are sent to communicate effectively' are not included in the above plan. We believe these things need to be weaved through everything we do and are contributing factors to making our Parish Pastoral Plan a success so we have included them as enablers.

Some of the key things that we need to utilise in order for this plan to make an impact on the church are:

- **Our parishioners** – we can't do anything without our Parishioners, your generosity, time and talents allow us to continue to grow as a community. This includes stewardship, our many community groups and individual talents
- **Communication** – this a fundamental element for everything we do, it allows our parishioners to know what is happening throughout the parish, find ways to get involved and provide feedback on what they like and what's working well (or not)
- **Administration** – there are systems and processes set up in the Parish to make things run smoothly such as Human Resources, Health & Safety, compliance activities, Parish registers, Pastoral availability, Parish hours, etc.
- **Finance** – our finances are an important aspect of keeping the Parish and our activities running well and to plan for our future
- **Buildings/physical assets** – a large amount of our resources are our buildings and physical assets so let's ensure they are put to best use
- **Other areas** – there are many other areas that will be able to help support achieving our Parish Pastoral Plan
